## **Cambridge Learner's Dictionary**



### Teacher's notes Usage

Aims: to help students use the dictionary effectively to understand how (in what context) words are used Skill: using the Cambidge Learner's Dictionary CD-ROM for independent language development Level: Pre-Intermediate

### 1. Introduction (10 minutes)

- Write the following on the board:
  - 1. Tom is a very <u>clever</u> student / Tom is a very brainy student.
  - 2. I like listening to my <u>CD player</u> / I like listening to my gramophone.
  - 3. When I <u>sleep</u>, I dream of you / When I <u>slumber</u>, I dream of you.
- Ask students to discuss in pairs or small groups what they think are the differences between the underlined words.
- · Ask students to feedback in class.
- In sentence 1 'clever' is a neutral word and 'brainy' is a very informal word that is usually used only in spoken English.
- In sentence 2 'gramophone' is an old-fashioned word. It's an old record player.
- In sentence 3 'slumber' is very poetic or literary and not usually used.
- Explain that the dictionary gives information like this about certain words using usage labels.

### 2. Class activity (15 minutes)

- Hand out the Class activity worksheet.
- Ask the students to look at the usage labels on the worksheet and elicit from them what the labels mean.
- Now ask the students to place the three words "slumber" (literary), "brainy" (informal) and "gramophone" (old-fashioned) into the table.
- Check that they understand the different usage.
- Now write the following words up on the board and ask the students to identify their usage: coke (trademark), yeah (spoken), examination (formal), prat (very informal), couch potato (humorous).
- Finally, ask the students to add any other examples they can think of. If there are computers available, encourage the students to check their answers on the Cambridge Learners Dictionary CD-ROM.

### 3. Homework (15 minutes)

- For homework hand out the Student research worksheets and ask the students to research the underlined words in the texts on the worksheet.
- Tell the students to write the meanings and usage of the underlined words into the table.
- Ensure you allocate time next lesson for students to present their work to the class. Use the Cambridge Learner's Dictionary CD-ROM as a tool when providing feedback.

#### TIP

- ⊙ To search for types of words by usage, use the *Advanced search* function on the CD-ROM.
- Click on the Advanced search symbol above the results list column on the top left of the dictionary. This will open the Advanced search window.
- Use the dropdown menus to add your search criteria, and then click on the usage menu and select the type of word that you are looking for.








