If someone is angry about something that has happened, you can say that they are annoyed or irritated: He was a bit annoyed with her for being late. • I was irritated that he didn't thank me.

If someone is extremely angry, you can use adjectives such as **furious**, **irate**, or **livid**: My boss was **furious** with me. • Hundreds of **irate** passengers have complained to the airline about its poor service.

If you are angry with a child, you might describe yourself as **cross**: *I'm cross with you for not telling me where you were going*.

The expression **up in arms** is sometimes used when people are angry about something they think is unfair: *Local people are up in arms over plans to close the local swimming pool*.

If someone suddenly becomes very angry, you can use the informal expressions go crazy/mad: Dad went crazy/mad when he found out we'd broken the window.
