Richard MacAndrew responds to questions about Blood Diamonds

Q. Did the film *Blood Diamonds* inspire the book or vice versa?

Q. How long did it take you to write the book?

A. Yes, I've written a number of other stories for Cambridge University Press, including some about a detective in Edinburgh called Jenny Logan; and some about a spy called lan Munro.
