

6 My sister works downtown.

Unit 6, Exercise 1

Listen to a statement, like this:

– Paul is Anne’s husband.

Make a statement about the second person, like this:

– **Anne is Paul’s wife.**

Listen to another example.

– Lisa is John’s sister. •

– **John is Lisa’s brother.**

Ready.

1. Emily is Anne’s daughter. •

Anne is Emily’s mother.

2. Paul is Jason’s father. •

Jason is Paul’s son.

3. Michael is Deborah’s brother. •

Deborah is Michael’s sister.

4. Julia is John and Sue’s daughter. •

John and Sue are Julia’s parents.

5. Tom is Jennifer’s father. •

Jennifer is Tom’s daughter.

Unit 6, Exercise 2

You hear a statement, like this:

– John walks to school.

Make the statement negative, like this:

– **John doesn’t walk to school.**

Listen to another example.

– Michael and Susan take the bus to work. •

– **Michael and Susan don’t take the bus to work.**

Ready.

1. Charles lives near here. •

Charles doesn’t live near here.

2. Sandy uses public transportation. •

Sandy doesn’t use public transportation.

3. Jim and Linda ride their bikes to school. •

Jim and Linda don’t ride their bikes to school.

4. You live with your parents. •

You don’t live with your parents.

5. Jason and Emily need a car. •

Jason and Emily don’t need a car.

Unit 6, Exercise 3

You hear a statement, like this:

– I have a car.

Make a statement about Sophie, like this:

– **Sophie has a car, too.**

Listen to another example.

– I do homework at home. •

– **Sophie does homework at home, too.**

Ready.

1. I go to school at night. •

Sophie goes to school at night, too.

2. I have a bike. •

Sophie has a bike, too.

3. I go downtown every day. •

Sophie goes downtown every day, too.

4. I have an apartment near here. •

Sophie has an apartment near here, too.

5. I do a lot of work. •

Sophie does a lot of work, too.

Unit 6, Exercise 4

You hear two statements, like this:

– Robert lives in the suburbs. Amy lives in the suburbs, too.

Join the two sentences using the word “and,” like this:

– **Robert and Amy live in the suburbs.**

Listen to another example.

– Susan has a car. Matthew has a car, too. •

– **Susan and Matthew have cars.**

Ready.

1. Michael takes the bus to work. Sarah takes the bus to work, too. •

Michael and Sarah take the bus to work.

2. John takes the subway to work. Brian takes the subway to work, too. •

John and Brian take the subway to work.

3. Peter has an apartment downtown. Paul has an apartment downtown, too. •

Peter and Paul have apartments downtown.

4. Michael does a lot of work at home. Mary does a lot of work at home, too. •

Michael and Mary do a lot of work at home.

5. Anita lives alone. Bill lives alone, too. •

Anita and Bill live alone.
